Thursday, May 6, 2021

CALL TO ORDER

Acknowledgement of Service – Superintendent of Operations, Venice Region, Bob Davis

Michael A. Shull, General Manager, presented a retirement citation to Mr. Davis. Several RAP Staff thanked Mr. Davis for his 41 years of service to the City.

Acknowledgement of Service – Principal Grounds Maintenance Supervisor, Therman Calloway, Jr.

Cathie Santo Domingo, Assistant General Manager, Planning, Maintenance, and Construction Branch presented a retirement citation to Mr. Calloway and thanked him for his 37 years of City service.

President Patsaouras and the Board Commissioners joined members of the public and former staff members in thanking Mr. Davis and Mr. Calloway for their service to the City and wished them well in retirement.

Vice-President Lynn Alvarez and Commissioner Joseph Halper joined the meeting during this time.

President Patsaouras called for a motion to approve the Regular Meeting Minutes of April 15, 2021. Commissioner Chase made such motion and it was seconded by Commissioner Bayne. There being no objections, the motion was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.

GENERAL MANAGER'S UPDATE

Michael A. Shull, General Manager, announced that RAP continues to work with City Council and the Mayor's Office in the budget process for next fiscal year. Mr. Shull shared that RAP was successful in retaining 140 positions which will allow for hiring of staff to support summertime operations to meet community needs. He stated that 103 summer camp sites will be active and registration began on April 29th for \$10 per week thanks in large part to a funding allocation from City Council and the Mayor's Office. Mr. Shull reported that registration for Week 1 of summer camp is 1400 kids and registration for Weeks 1-9 stands at over 11,000 kids. He concluded his remarks by sharing his expectations of the summer camp program in terms of participation, safety protocols, and logistics.

Deanne Dedmon, Acting Superintendent, Pacific Region, presented the Update on RAP's Park Advisory Boards (PAB). Ms. Dedmon provided some background on the PAB system as well as the mission of the program. She also shared how PABs interact with RAP staff to achieve their goals.
