### RECOMMENDATION:

Accept a donation of a horse "UzziYahoo (Bert)" for the Park Ranger Division Mounted Unit and direct that appropriate recognition be given to the donor.

### SUMMARY:

The Park Ranger Division Mounted Unit (Division) is responsible for patrolling park trails, conducting presentations for interpretive programs and representing the Department of Recreation and Parks (RAP) at various events. Well-trained horses that will remain calm in various interactions with the public are required for this job. Lisa Alulis, a private citizen, has graciously offered to donate her horse, "UzziYahoo (Bert)", to RAP for use by the Division. "UzziYahoo (Bert)" is a 20-year-old Dutch Warmblood gelding that is of good health and temperament and would be well suited to the work of the Division.

Accepting this donation would allow the Division to keep up its current stable of four horses, as another of its horses has been retired from service.

### FISCAL IMPACT:

Accepting this donation, with an estimated value of Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000), will save RAP the cost of purchasing another horse to replace the horse that has been retired. All care and feeding costs will be transferred from the retired horse to this horse, resulting in no additional impact to RAP's General Fund.
