It is clear we are imposed on at the expense of the entities that choose to promote the area without any skin in the game. Reflecting on the recent RAM use, I wondered why the Chamber and sign trust were part of the decision making body for allowing RAM. The sign’s jurisdiction is under the RAP Commission and the Department. The city owns the sign and land and carries the liability associated with it. The Chamber is not directly involved at all. Their ownership of the servicemark really has nothing to do with the physical 9 letters. The trust’s purpose is to care for the sign, maintain it. All this is so very odd and clearly does not follow proper process. Relative to the unauthorized agreement to maintaining the sign, what criteria do you list as maintenance? Would you please share the expectations your department has identified and what type of maintenance schedule the trust presents annually to the department?

In addition, the Significant Ecological Area that the sign, Innsdale and all the open space bordering Hollywoodland (the Hollywoodland Gifted Park) should be protected not promoted. If the department understood that we would not need to look for money. RAP should be on that side of the issue, not in the business of creating an amusement park.





At the 25-Feb-2022 VeniceBid Board meeting, Isabella Dennis of CD11 was talking about fencing the park on the Venice Blvd median by the Venice library (the City calls it Centennial Park).

The fence would be used to keep unhoused people out and close the space off. Likely this would happen just after a displacement sweep, because that is how its usually done.

I would also note that a displacement sweep (the City calls it "comprehensive cleaning") was announced for this park, happening 07-Mar-2022, at this same VeniceBID meeting.

I am, my organization is, and many others are extremely opposed to using displacement sweeps and homeless-hostile architecture to remove unhoused people from public space.

If you have never seen it, these are the guiding principles for Services Not Sweeps, which we support:

A thoughtful group of Los Angeles organization leaders wrote this together. Please read it all, especially #6 which pertains directly to the methodology that includes law enforcement and closing public space.

I was personally present at this Centennial park on 17-Feb-2022 when LAPD, under the color of law, was there to tell unhoused people to leave the park and the VeniceBID was there to throw away belongings people couldn't carry.

There was no notice. Just LAPD and VeniceBID working together. When I arrived at approximately 2pm law enforcement was getting an unhoused man to leave the park, surrender his belongings so VeniceBID could haul it off and then say it's trash.

I understand that there are extremely active NIMBY emailers and callers in Venice. Unfortunately, there has not been much of a stern shaming from our local city representatives over the years for all the lies and mean spirited negativity. Not to mention the obstruction waged against homeless solutions by these people. But now is the time.

Now is the time for standing for humane solutions, not placating the negatively and lies with fences and harmful sweeps.

It's not time for putting in temporary fencing for any reason, including some ill-conceived child installation promoted by people with an anti-homeless agenda, like Ms Murez.

This has been a virtually unused park, since developed, located on the median between a somewhat heavily traveled Venice Blvd. It's much much better and safer than a cold sidewalk, which is what some of these people will be faced with.

The average life span for our chronically unhoused community is 47 years old and I can attest that a cold sidewalk contributes to these early, extremely sad deaths.

Furthermore, the Venice heritage museum is planning this park for its home in July 2023. There is no need for fencing and displacement of unhoused people at this time. It is a cruel waste of funds that could otherwise go to real solutions.

At the 25-Feb-2022 VeniceBID Board meeting, Isabella Dennis of CD11 was talking about fencing the park on the Venice Blvd median by the Venice library (the City calls it Centennial Park).

The proposed fence would be used to keep unhoused people out and close the space off. I am concerned about the effect this would have on the dozens of people currently on a waiting list for housing who are set up there. I have personally spoken with many of these people in the course of my work as a Survey Coordinator on the LA LEADS project and I know this to be as clean and orderly an encampment as I have seen anywhere in the City.

I saw disturbing video of the LAPD action on 17-Feb-2022 when they sent armed officers there to tell unhoused people to leave the park and the VeniceBID was there to throw away belongings people couldn't carry. This action was carried out without the proper notice which would have given people the opportunity to plan ahead.

In addition, I understand that notice for a displacement sweep by the City was announced for this park, happening 07-Mar-2022, at this same VeniceBID meeting. I am extremely opposed to using displacement sweeps and homeless-hostile architecture to remove unhoused people from public space. I have seen these tactics used throughout the City and know that they only lead to displacement of homeless people who have nowhere else to go. This terrible policy makes it harder for social service providers to follow-up with them, and makes them even more vulnerable to attacks in unfamiliar areas.

If you have never seen it, these are the guiding principles for Services Not Sweeps, which I support:

Venice has seen a remarkable reduction in the number of homeless people camping over the past year and I am hopeful that the successful strategy of targeted and sustained outreach leading to various housing options will prevail over the sweeps and hostile architecture policies pursued in other parts of the City. Now is the time to stand for humane and positive solutions, not fences and harmful sweeps.

There is no need for fencing and displacement of unhoused people at this time. It is a cruel waste of funds that could otherwise go to real solutions.





>> I have been calling LAPD for the past several days and reporting the growing problem. They have done nothing. Today I spoke to a 911 supervisor and she told me the following: LAPD has no criteria for dispatching officers to calls that report people living in their vehicles. This means they will not dispatch officers. The 911 dispatcher told me this is due to a directive they received from the Mayor's office. That directive, originally dated June 2020, revised Dec 2, 2020, according to her, instructed LAPD to stand down and allow people to continue dwelling in their vehicles. People experiencing homelessness are exempt from any form of enforcement. No towing, no removal, no nothing. So it is the Mayor's office that is allowing this to happen.

>> Right now the park is spinning out of control - worse every day. We need to do something and we need to do it quickly. Urban Alchemy/CIRCLE and the Police are just referring me to each other and neither organization will do anything. It is the old "empty chair syndrome." Just blame the person who is not in the room. As we knew and have been telling everyone, allowing support services in the Westminster Senior Center will attract encampments to the Park - it is already happening at an alarming rate - and will destroy the safety of our neighborhood. And it is happening even without the decompression center/shelter. The mere presence of Urban Alchemy and CIRCLE is apparently sufficient to destroy our park. So the conversation is no longer about whether decompression is OK in the park. It is obvious that the relevant conversation is whether UA/CIRCLE is OK in the park. Me thinks not. The parking lot is already untenable. And the park will follow.

The situation that is developing in Westminster Park in Venice is rapidly spinning out of control. When we

met last week there were 5 or 6 vehicles parked in the Westminster parking lot. Now there are 10 or 11. And the mood is changing. When we met, the people living in their cars in the park were keeping a low profile. Now, it is turning into a major scofflaw party. More tents going up, more liv-aboard vehicles, personal property and trash strewn on the sidewalk, awnings, barbecues, furniture, stolen bikes, drinking and drug use. All open and notoriously conducted right under the noses of the Urban Alchemy folk who are occupying the senior center building. Apparently there was a fight that broke out late last night in the parking lot. This is rapidly becoming a full-blown City sponsored disaster, just like the Venice Bridge Home Shelter, just like we warned you that it would. And all just one block from an elementary school. Those of us who have watched these "trainwreck" events occur in our park in the past know that it takes very little time to lose control of the park, then months of hard work to correct the problem. This is headed towards becoming another black eye for the mayor - another community severely damaged in the wake of yet another ill-conceived City plan.

I talked with Urban Alchemy folk about the problem and they told me to call the police. I called the LAPD and they told me that it is the mayor's office that has directed them to stand down and that is why they refuse to respond to my calls. They cited COVID protocols put in place by the mayor. I remind you, that reasoning does not resonate well with the community. We are all back at work. The mask mandate is soon to expire. Life is returning to normal, but our politicians and police tell us that COVID prevents them from forcing someone to move out of the park (despite the fact that they only recently moved into the park!) Telling us that only sounds like more lies. Such excuse making does not pass the red-faced test - it sounds ridiculous. No one in our community believes it.

Right now, City-implemented policies are importing a significant safety problem into our neighborhood, park, right next to an elementary school. City-implemented policies are threatening the safety of our children. I do not need to remind you that these concerns are real. Less than a year ago a house across the street from the park was intentionally set on fire. It was a total loss. A dog perished in the blaze despite neighbors' attempts to save it.

Please do not sacrifice one community while implementing unproven methodologies to help another. It is not an acceptable solution to address one problem by creating another even bigger problem. The City has already severely damaged the community around the Venice Bridge Home Shelter and achieved only marginal results (shelter never fully utilized, tents still on street, etc.). Please do not repeat that mistake in the Westminster Park neighborhood. Please do not import a problem into our community.

Please do the right thing. Either Urban Alchemy must be charged with keeping the park and surrounding neighborhood cleared, or the program at the Westminster Senior Center must be terminated.

I have attached a document titled "**RAP PC Mar. 3, 2022**", which is pretty much the transcript of this morning's Public Comment.

Recognition by the RAP Management that the incident should have been handled differently would have brought a resolution to this matter long ago.

However, rather than look at the incident objectively and acting appropriately, the RAP Management has been only interested in protecting the unjustifiable and unlawful conduct of Chief Ranger Losorelli.

The RAP Commission should have great concern not only with the Chief Ranger and Officer Pompa, but also the top Management and Harold Fujita who was given the task by the Commission to investigate the incident and chose to purposely mislead the Commission with his vague and dis-honest conclusion.

I am also very concerned with the fact that Captain Joyce did accept or investigate the Complaint that I filed in Marh of 2021. I was advised by the CD4 that filing the complaint with the Ranger Department was the proper procedure, unfortunately, the complaint was not accepted, because Captain Joyce said the incident was already investigated by HR.

My criminal jeopardy ended when the City Attorney dismissed the charge against me on or about June 10th, of 2021 pursuant to 1385 of the CA Penal Code.

However, in Sept. of 2021, I filed a complaint with the LA County D.A.s office and in Nov of 2021, I was told it was had logged in for review on Sept 29th 2021. Then after a few communications, I was told by the Attorney who is handling my complaint, that an investigator from the D.A.s office will further contact me. In order for a complaint to go forward there must be evidence of crimes committed and the ability to prove it beyond reasonable doubt. Therefore, based on the evidence and information I have provided to the LA County D.A., they are investigating the incident and therefore the Chief Ranger for criminal behavior.

I have just a few questions that hopefully can be answered

1. Was the Commission aware of the Criminal Complaint and Investigation?
2. Are they willing to re-examine the issue and have Captain Joyce accept my complaint and perform a real investigation and have it kept on file as it should have been last year?

Here is the latest update and a review of the unjustifiable and unlawful behavior by Chief Ranger Losorelli on March 23, 2020.

Dear Mr. Shull and RAP Commissioners:

Last year, the Safe Parking program at Westchester Park was moved to the parking lot that serves the ball fields, and a permit was issued to increase that program from five or six to 25 parking spots. No notice of these permit requests or approvals were given to the community or the Neighborhood Council, and the community was therefore prevented from giving any input into that process or participating in it in any way. (See https://www.westsidecurrent.com/news/westchester-residents-not-consulted-about-safe-parking/article_e96728ae-740c-11ec-95b8-a70604d45c25.html.)

We understand the permit for Safe Parking will expire June 30, 2022. We request notice of any requests for extension of that permit and any other Safe Parking requests pertaining to that program relating to Westchester Park.

Westchester Park has not recovered from the homeless occupation of the park for two years during covid shutdowns. We still have many vehicle dwellers, in RVs and cars, living in the parking lots of the park. (See photos below for a few examples--there are many others.) Many Safe Parking users, maybe most of them, simply move from the Safe Parking lot to other parking spots during the daytime. Thus, they are full-time vehicle dwellers in the park.

The ball fields are now being renovated, and we expect the fields will be ready for use in June. Our Senior Center has reopened. However, few seniors are willing to go to the Senior Center because they are frightened and feel unsafe because of the vehicle dwellers in the parking lot outside the Senior Center. Parents, league presidents, coaches, and children are all very concerned about homeless people using Safe Parking in the lot closest to the ball fields because many of the people using the Safe Parking simply move to other parking spaces in the parking lot during the day so they are there all the time. At least two children have been physically attacked by homeless people in the public restrooms of the park while trying to participate in sports. A recent PRA request of LAPD shows calls to those two parking lots in the past few months--after tent dwellers left the park and only the vehicle dwellers remain.

Also, the Safe Parking program next to the lot closest to the ball fields uses 25 parking spaces. There is no parking on Lincoln Avenue, which runs alongside the park where the ballfields are located. Lincoln Avenue is seven lanes wide and cars drive at freeway speeds. The street is also dark during much of the year when children are playing sports in the park after 5 p.m. It is unsafe for children and families to park on the other side of Lincoln and attempt to cross the street.

LA is a "park poor" city and Westchester Park is used almost equally by children and youth of African-American, Latino, and Caucasian groups. At least two leagues, Westchester Vikings Pop Warner Football and LAX Youth Baseball, provided scholarships, transportation, and other services to children and youth from east of the 405. We have a young LAPD officer who is in the process of starting a football league in the park for boys and girls from South Central and also for youth close to the park, but cannot do so until the park is safe. League presidents and coaches in general do not feel comfortable about having their players, for whom they are responsible, exposed to the risk. The park should be safe and have adequate parking as a matter of racial and social equity. Girls have been the most frequent targets of

harassment, incidents of indecent exposure, and attacks by homeless people in the park and are at greater risk by being in the park. Therefore, safety in the park is a matter of gender equity. (See https://www.westsidecurrent.com/news/westchester-versus-pacific-palisades-field-permits-and-the-safe-parking-program/article_a489d7da-72d7-11ec-a63f-4bf990dbf4c2.html.)

Westchester Park will not be safe for children and seniors until the parking lots are safe for them to use and until they have an adequate number of parking spots to safely accommodate them.

While we support Safe Parking, we ask that it be moved to a location other than the park. We are informed that there are 430 City parks in LA, and Westchester Park is the only one of those parks with a Safe Parking program. We believe this is likely a reflection of the fact that Safe Parking programs and park uses by children and youth are not considered to be compatible uses, and the fact that other locations for Safe Parking should be used.

We also note that the Safe Parking lot is not heavily used (see first photo below), yet it is fenced and the 25 spaces cannot be used by park users. (See <https://www.circlingthenews.com/safe-parking-effectiveness/>.) Undoubtedly, there are parking lots of government buildings that can be used for Safe Parking, instead of using a park. For example, we have heard that LADOT is considering the use of their parking lots for Safe Parking.

We also request notice of any requests to extend the Safe Parking program, change the number of parking spots in the program, or have a Safe Parking program in another parking lot of the park, such as the one outside Council Member Bonin's office, because that parking lot is shared by people who use the senior center (see last four photos below taken in the senior center and senior center parking lot). The remaining parking lot in the park is used by adults and children using the Recreation Center, the skate park, and the tennis courts.

My name is Savannah, and I am a resident of the immediate neighborhood surrounding Pershing Square. I've lived here for the past 2.5 years and use the dog park at Pershing daily.

I'm contacting you today out of immense frustration. Every time an event is thrown at the park, the dog park- an absolute essential service- gets taken away from the residents. This to me seems completely unnecessary and is a huge negative consequence to us residents. The added frustration is that you never post within the park ahead of time when this service will be taken from us. In a one block radius of the park, there are 7 completely residential apartment buildings. We're looking at approximately 1000 people. How many dogs do you think are owned by this many people? Hundreds, at a minimum. We all use the Pershing Square dog park.

I spoke with the park hired security today, who told me to speak with Stephanie and Cesar in the office upstairs regarding my concerns. I then went up to the Hill St side of the park that had an open area of the sand and let my dog do her business. Then the event hired security (his name was something like Trayvon- picture attached) came over and threatened to call the police over me doing this? Are you joking? Do you condone this kind of treatment to the public by your vendors? Treating me like I'm destroying property or something... power hungry- child like behavior, that is wildly unnecessary. At this point I went to the office to have my conversation but it was blocked off by the event gates. So I had to go back to the park security and they were kind enough to get Stephanie for me to speak to her. Unfortunately this conversation was equally as frustrating as Stephanie basically said you guys have no accountability surrounding this matter and she clearly didn't care at all. She said that the vendors rent out the entire park, and the residents and it's needs completely cease to exist. The only thing beneficial to me from the conversation was getting your contact, Cesar.

This problem, as mentioned, affects hundreds of residents. We need this dog park and it doesn't need to be taken away- ever. The design of that part of the park could easily be blocked off on the park side of the walkway completely leaving the dog area accessible for use. The minor difference in area to the vendor would mean you could still charge the same price for rental- then everybody wins.

This situation feels very much like the city cares more about profits over people. Is that the case here? You have an opportunity here to make things better for the people of LA. How can I expect you to take action on this? I'd very much like to hear back from you and what the next steps can and will be. I will also be distributing your contact info to the residents of the neighborhood so they can also weigh in on the matter. Do you care about people? Or just profits? Thank you in advance.
